Key Terms

Business Directory: a website or publication that lists all businesses within a certain category or region

Employment Assistance: services designed to assist individuals in finding employment, in many cases free of charge

Labour Market Information: information about occupations, wage rates, unemployment rates, employment outlooks, education and training, and economic trends and conditions

Promising Occupations: jobs that will be in demand in the next 3-5 years in Windsor-Essex

Volunteering: the act of performing unpaid services for the purpose of developing new skills and acquiring new contacts
