Managers in agriculture:

Managers in agriculture plan, organize, direct, control, and evaluate the operations and functions of farms.

Job Duties:

Managers in agriculture manage the overall operations of a farm, ranch, or orchard and determine the amount and kinds of crops to be grown and livestock to be raised. Managers in agriculture organize and co-ordinate planting, cultivating, and crop harvesting activities and the raising and breeding of livestock and poultry. They hire and manage farm personnel; establish marketing programs; develop and keep financial and production records; purchase farm machinery, livestock, seed, feed, and other supplies; and maintain farm machinery, equipment, and buildings. Managers in agriculture also perform farming duties.

Working Conditions:

Work for managers in agriculture takes place both indoors and outdoors, so workers may be exposed to various weather conditions.


The workers use machinery, tools, and heavy farm equipment, such as tractors, which can pose the risk of injury.

Strong odours are common on a farm and farmers may be exposed to chemicals, dust, and sand in the workplace. Workers may also be exposed to infectious bacteria and viruses as a result of treating sick animals.
