## Virtual Panel Discussion on Anti-Gender-Based Violence for Frontline Workers

On December 3, 2021, the Windsor-Essex Local Immigration Partnership, in collaboration with YMCA of Southwestern Ontario, Immigrant and Refugee Communities Neighbours, Friends and Families Campaign (IRCNFF), and the Violence Against Women Coordinating Committee of Windsor Essex organized an educational opportunity to learn strategies to prevent and address Gender- Based Violence.

The event took place virtually with 114 frontline workers consisting of settlement advisors, LINC instructors and staff providing services for newcomers in attendance. Ambassadors for the Immigrant and Refugee Communities Neighbours, Friends and Families Campaign and Peer Champions from across the province participated in this virtual panel discussion.

This discussion provided an opportunity to shine a light on the needs and barriers local refugees and immigrants face in addition to sharing successful service delivery strategies.
