Material Handlers:

Material Handlers handle, move, load, and unload materials by hand or using a variety of material handling equipment. They also sort, store, and issue parts and supplies for use by the establishment in which they work and for sale to the public. **Material Handlers** may operate equipment such as industrial trucks or tractors, to transport materials to and from transportation vehicles to loading docks.

Job Duties:

Material Handlers (manual) load, unload, and move products and materials by hand or using basic material handling equipment. They move household appliances and furniture onto and

off moving trucks or vans and perform other material handling activities such as counting, weighing, sorting, packing, and unpacking.

Material Handlers (equipment operators) operate winches and other loading devices to load and unload materials onto and off trucks, railway cars, and loading docks of warehouses and industrial establishments. Material Handlers (equipment operators) operate industrial trucks, tractors, loaders, and other equipment to transport materials to and from transportation vehicles and loading docks and to store and retrieve materials in warehouses. They connect hoses or pipes and operate equipment to load and unload liquid petroleum, chemical, or other products into or from tank cars, tank trucks, or storage tanks. Material Handlers (equipment operators) also operate equipment to dump materials such as coal, ore, and rain into or to remove materials from railway cars, trucks, or other vehicles and operate conveyors and equipment to transfer grain or other materials from transportation vehicles to elevators, bins, or other storage areas.

Working Conditions:

Work takes place indoors and outdoors in various weather conditions.

Work is done near or with equipment, instruments, machinery or power/hand tools that may be a source of accident or injury.

Workers may be exposed to toxic chemicals, noise and vibration.


Career Pathways:

Adequate physical strength is required for manual Material Handlers who work with heavy materials. Much of the work can be physically demanding.
