



WE LIP Summary of the

Listening to You: a Look at Local
Health Care Event

Care - Share - Aware

DATE: October 9, 2014

TIME: 9:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.

LOCATION: Caboto Club, Windsor, ON

Working in partnership with the Erie St. Clair Local Health Integration Network (ESC LHIN), WELIP members supported the *Listening to You: a Look at Local Health Care event* on October 9th, 2014. Over 120 participants came together with a common goal of improving the patient experience for newcomer/immigrants access the local health care system. In addition to language specific tables and small group interpretation, there were tables assigned for health services providers who wanted to be a part of this important conversation. This was a welcome addition to the patient focus group, and is a good beginning to more formalized conversations to take place in the near future. Twenty four designated notes takers captured the conversations at the tables. This feedback was compiled into a jointly authored report. The ESC LHIN Communications team also conducted video interviews with newcomer/immigrant participants who wanted to share their health care journey at the event. The final report and videos will be shared with the WE LIP Council, community stakeholders, residents, the ESC LHIN Board of Directors and health care providers to help educate and influence system change.

We look forward to future opportunities to work together in improving health care access and patient experience for the whole community-from point of arrival to settlement and across the care continuum. As this was a patient focus group with limited time for meaningful and personal discussions, a formal evaluation form was not provided to participants. However, comments that were received by email have been compiled below:

YMCA staff and volunteers received a variety of feedback regarding the event, *Listening to You: a Look at Local Health Care.* Overall, many of the participants took the time to let Table Facilitators know that they were grateful for the opportunity to share their experiences with such an important and integral healthcare body as the LHIN. Whether their experience with the healthcare system in Erie St. Clair was positive or negative, there was a sense of appreciation from the newcomer community that they were able to share their storoes with individuals who were open to understanding their situations and committed to pursuing change or support in the sector.
