

Windsor Essex's 2017 Vital Signs Report and Community Conversation at WE LIP Council Meeting

December 2017

Windsor-Essex's 2017 Vital Signs report was released to the community on October 3, 2017 at the Windsor Star News Café. According to the WindsorEssex Community Foundation, our community responded that we are doing OK when it comes to the quality of life in Windsor-Essex and identified priorities to address moving forward.

"The Vital Signs report is an excellent resource that we use throughout the year to guide our grantmaking at the WECF," stated Lisa Kolody, Executive Director. "It outlines where the strengths and needs exist in Windsor-Essex, identifies local priorities, and it informs where our funding will provide the greatest impact locally. More and more local agencies are incorporating Vital Signs data in their program planning."

WE LIP Community Connector, Michelle Suchiu was invited to present examples of how the community is working together to make Windsor-Essex more welcoming.











On December 12, 2017 the Windsor Essex Local Immigration Partnership invited its members to be a part of the Windsor-Essex Vital Signs Getting Started Community Conversation held during the WE LIP Winter 2017 Council meeting.

The conversation focused on employment, welcoming, youth and seniors as it relates to newcomers in Windsor-Essex. Over 50 council members were provided information from guest speakers:

WindsorEssex Express Entry Employer Breakfast

January 24, 2018

For a second time, WE LIP member organizations, in partnership with Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada, came together to plan a 2 day agenda to raise awareness of the Express Entry System; a process which is designed to manage applications for permanent residence under the:

- Federal Skilled Worker Program (FSWP),
- Federal Skilled Trades Program (FSTP),
- Canadian Experience Class (CEC) and
- A portion of the Provincial Nominee Program (PNP).



January 23, 2018 - Express Entry International Student Presentations:

Express Entry information was presented to 128 students from St. Clair College and the University of Windsor.

January 24, 2018 - Express Entry Employer Breakfast:

A morning information session at the Institute for Border Logistics and Security was organized for employers and community stakeholders. The 59 attendees, including 24 various employers, were provided Express Entry information from Keynote speaker Steven Owen, Employer Liaison Officer (Ontario) with Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada.

Additionally, partners shared details about the Select for Success Program (New Canadians' Centre of Excellence Inc.) and the Destination Canada Program (Réseau de soutien à l'immigration francophone du Centre-Sud-Ouest de l'Ontario).

January 24, 2018 - Employer Meetings:

Individual meetings with Steven Owen were arranged for local employers who required specific support in using the Express Entry system.

Regional Children's Centre Trillium Funding Announcement

February 23, 2018

On Friday, February 23, Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare's (HDGH) Regional Children's Centre (RCC) officially announced their Triple P – Positive Parenting Program® has received a Trillium Grow Grant to gear the service to our newcomer community.

An additional \$139,000 over 24 months will allow the cultural adaptation of the program for the Arab newcomer community recognizing the need to support their mental health and wellbeing. It has also allowed the program to welcome Dr. Nesreen ElKord, who will aid with the adaptation and help test this Triple P specialty program in Windsor/Essex.

"Transitioning to a new country can be very challenging, we hope by providing this support we can aid newcomer families as they adjust to their life in Canada. Triple P programs promote positive parenting strategies, which lead to well-adjusted children who have the skills and confidence they need to be successful," explained Tammy Drazilov, Community Practice Coordinator with RCC. "This Trillium Grow Grant will not only allow for the program to be translated into their native language but will also meet the cultural needs of this specific population."

The announcement was delivered during the Windsor Essex Local Immigration Partnership's (WE LIP) Annual General meeting, where partners and stakeholders discussed initiatives and plans to make Windsor-Essex a more welcoming and inclusive community.
