WORKFORCE WINDSORESSEX HIGHLIGHTS IN-DEMAND AGRICULTURE JOBS

Students and jobseekers tour local agriculture and agri-food companies on Agri-Day Tour

Windsor, ON – Workforce WindsorEssex, the region’s Local Employment Planning Council (LEPC), held Agri-Day on Tuesday, September 24, to highlight local in-demand jobs in the agriculture sector. Agri-Day allows local students and jobseekers, 350 this year, the opportunity to tour different agriculture and agri-food companies throughout Windsor-Essex, including traditional farms, greenhouse supply, and food manufacturing facilities.

Tours took place at Mucci Farms, Plant Products Inc., Inner Seasonings International Inc., and Highline Mushrooms.

Agri-Day is part of Workforce WindsorEssex’s initiative to encourage agriculture careers in the region, as Windsor-Essex needs more skilled workers in the agriculture and agri-food sector to help local companies grow and compete in the 21st century.

Earlier this year, Workforce WindsorEssex launched *A Career Guide for the Agriculture & Agri-Food Sector in Windsor-Essex*, exploring the top 52 in-demand agriculture and agri-food occupations in the region. It also highlights the skills and experience that those in vulnerable manufacturing occupations can transfer to the agriculture sector.

QUICK FACTS:

- As of 2018, there were 6,938 individuals employed in the agriculture and agri-food sector in Windsor-Essex (Pg. 8, [A Career Guide for the Agriculture & Agri-Food Sector in Windsor-Essex](#)).
- The Leamington CA area (Leamington and Kingsville) is widely known for its large concentration of greenhouse operations. The area has been rapidly growing in recent years and contains over 60% of Ontario’s greenhouses, the largest concentration of greenhouses in both Canada and the U.S. (Pg. 10, [A Career Guide for the Agriculture & Agri-Food Sector in Windsor-Essex](#)).
- The rapid growth of this area means that new greenhouses will have to be constructed, or existing greenhouses may have to be retro-fitted to support a new type of crop production, such as cannabis. This new demand for construction will likely raise the demand for jobs like carpenters, concrete finishers, and welders (Pg. 10, [A Career Guide for the Agriculture & Agri-Food Sector in Windsor-Essex](#)).
