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WORKFORCE WINDSORESSEX RELEASES REPORT ON FEMALE ENTREPRENEURIAL ECOSYSTEM TO SUPPORT AND HIGHLIGHT SUCCESSES

51% of female entrepreneurs believe Windsor-Essex is moving in a positive direction to improve support for female entrepreneurs

Windsor, ON – Today, Workforce WindsorEssex released a new report on female entrepreneurs as part of their annual RISE Needs Assessment.

To inform the annual report, female entrepreneurs shared their experiences with local programming for business owners, what government supports they use or need, and how service providers could better support female founders in Windsor-Essex.

As part of Women's Entrepreneurship Strategy's efforts, Workforce WindsorEssex highlights the good work that is being done in the Windsor-Essex community and shares success stories of organizations and initiatives that are lifting up local female entrepreneurs.

With a focus on female entrepreneurs in Windsor-Essex, Workforce WindsorEssex continues to develop the RISE Windsor-Essex Needs Assessment Report. Based on community consultations, the reports provide an overview of the challenges facing women in their careers as entrepreneurs, and the successes of community organizations, entrepreneurs, and education institutions.

The main challenges local entrepreneurs identified facing include a lack of specific services for diverse women, limited programming for later stage businesses, and a need for more local business advisors. The celebrated successes for our community include organizational expertise growth, increased interest in STEM, supported growth from venter to storefront, and more one-on-one learning opportunities. The RISE Needs Assessment's recommendations for the community are to develop targeted supports for Indigenous and immigrant entrepreneurs, increase collaboration between service providers, and increase entrepreneurship supports in the county.

RISE is a network of organizations that empower women in entrepreneurship and women in STEM in Windsor-Essex. Founded by Invest WindsorEssex, through partnerships with the Small Business & Entrepreneurship Centre, the University of Windsor's EPICentre, Workforce WindsorEssex, WEtech Alliance, Build-A-Dream, and Windsor Essex Capital Angel Network (WECAN). The purpose of RISE is to create a suite of services available to women in the Windsor-Essex region by amalgamating and supporting resources with the goal of increasing the number of women in these fields.
