PROGRAM DEFINITIONS

<u>Canada Connects</u>	Canada Connects is an initiative to help newcomers settle by matching them with Canadian citizens or longtime community members.
Community connections	Services that help to connect clients with the broader community, public institutions, and community organizations. These services also provide opportunities for partners, volunteers, and local community members to be actively engaged in settlement programming.
Employment-related services	Services that directly equip clients with employment-related skills and support in accessing the labour market. These services include preparation for the credential assessment process. Eligible services include employment bridging initiatives, employment-related mentoring and networking, and employment and credential assessment counselling, skills development and training.
Information and orientation	Services that provide clients with information about Canada and the community in which they intend to settle. They also help clients to develop the life skills they need to integrate into Canadian society. Eligible services include port of entry services, dissemination of information products (electronic or print), orientation sessions, promotion and outreach, individual and family consultations or counselling, and information referral.
Language training	Services that support clients in developing official language skills required for the labour market and/or navigating life outside work. Eligible services include language assessment such as placement testing and referrals, formal language training classes, and informal language learning sessions.
<u>Library Settlement Partnerships (LSP)</u>	The Library Settlement Partnerships (LSP) offers a unique and innovative newcomer information service in 11 communities throughout Ontario. This service includes one-on-one settlement information and referrals, group information sessions, and community outreach. Over 60 newcomer settlement workers from 23 agencies work out of the 49 branches of 11 public libraries in communities with high newcomer populations. Services are provided in a variety of languages, based on community needs.
Needs and assets assessment and referrals	Services that provide formal reviews of client needs across a broad spectrum of settlement areas and connect clients to settlement and community-based services. Eligible services include needs and assets assessments and reassessments, the development of personalized settlement plans, and referrals to CIC-funded and other settlement services.
<u>Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS)</u>	Settlement Workers in Schools is a partnership between IRCC, school boards and community organizations. This program assigns Settlement workers to help newcomer students and their families across the country by providing personalized support to ease their integration into their school system.
Support Services that Enable Clients to Access Services	Services that play an essential role in enabling clients to access the direct service components outlined below. Eligible support services include childcare, translation and interpretation services, crisis counselling, transportation assistance, and provisions for disabilities. These barrier-reducing services are always provided in conjunction with a direct service.
<u>Youth Employment and Skills Strategy (YESS)</u>	Through the YESS, the Government of Canada helps young people, particularly those facing barriers to employment, get the information and gain the skills, work experience and abilities they need to make a successful transition into the labour market. ESDC's YESS program supports organizations that provide job placements and skills development services to young people, as well as a broad range of supports such as job coaching, mental health support, clothes for job interviews, day care services for parents and subsidized Internet access to help with job searches.
