



# **Pathway to Potential Funded Programming**

# **Recreation Program Discount**

The 90% Pathway to Potential (P2P) Recreation Discount toward recreation, culture, and arts programming is available for families living with low-income and Ukrainian Visitors.

In the City of Windsor, children aged 0-17 are eligible for the P2P recreation discount toward programs and/or an Adventure Bay Membership/Pass. Families can also apply the P2P discount toward two weeks of Summer Camp (runs July 3<sup>rd</sup> to Sept 1<sup>st</sup>).

Families are also able to apply for the 90% P2P discount with recreational facilities across Essex County, including the Town of Tecumseh, Town of LaSalle, Town of Essex, Municipality of Leamington, Town of Kingsville, Municipality of Lakeshore, and Amherstburg Community Services. # **Affordable Pass Program**

The Affordable Pass Program (APP) allows eligible Windsor-Essex residents to save 49% off the cost of a 30-Day bus pass from Transit Windsor. Families living with low income, including Permanent Residents, and Ukrainian Visitors are eligible to apply for the APP.

# **Be Back Soon Program**



#### **Orientation Services**

#### What are Orientation Services?

Orientation services provide information to newcomers on government programs and services, community and social services, education, immigration, housing, employment, and community connections. These services assist newcomers to settle and adjust to a new life in Canada and include:

#### **Needs and Assets Assessment and Referrals**

Personalized and self-directed assessments conducted to assist newcomers and identify their needs, barriers, and strengths. Visit <a href="https://www.wevalue.ca">www.wevalue.ca</a> for more information.

#### **Settlement Plans & Goals**

Based on a newcomer's initial needs and assets assessment a personalized settlement plan is created with short-term and long-term goals.

#### **One-on-One Supports**

One-on-one supports are available to all newcomers through our Newcomer Settlement Advisors who can help guide, inform, and provide individuals and families with the information, assistance, and resources they need to settle into their new life in Canada.

#### **Digital Literacy Support**

Digital navigation is a major challenge for newcomers. Our Digital Navigator assesses a newcomer's needs and provides digital literacy skills orientation and training to increase access to digital/hybrid services.

#### Information Sessions

Information sessions are 1-2 hours in length and provide important information on a wide variety of topics such as: Overview of Canada, Canadian Law & Justice, Employment & Income, Education, Housing, Health, Money & Finance, Transportation and Becoming a Canadian Citizen. When possible, information sessions are delivered in a client group's first language.

# **Community Connections**

Community Connections programming connects you with social and professional networks, community organizations, resources, events, and activities. Connecting with other newcomers and Canadians can help you feel engaged, welcomed, and help you gain independence in your new community. Monthly activities and events may include: events about culture & history, field trips to community resources and local services, sports and recreation events, neighbourhood days, conversation circles, networking activities with other newcomers or Canadian citizens.

# Newcomer Youth - YMAP (12 to 24 years old)

YMAP's main goal is to provide support and enrichment opportunities for newcomer youth to ease the adjustment to Canadian life. Through sessions based on themes such as life-skills training, career exploration, community involvement, and leadership development, newcomer youth is supported to achieve their goals and become active community participants. YMAP helps youth create meaningful and long-lasting friendships, develop and enhance leadership skills, increase confidence and assertiveness, gain Canadian experience and a sense of belonging, practice and improve English language skills.
