## **Temporary Foreign Workers Community Conversation Forum Panel Discussion**



On March 7th, 2024, The Windsor Essex Local Immigration Partnership and the TeaMWork Project organized the Temporary Foreign Worker Community Conversation Forum panel at the Links of Kent Golf Club & Event Centre in Chatham-Kent. The panel was moderated by Irek Kusmierczyk, MP Windsor-Tecumseh and the Parliamentary Secretary for the Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Official Languages. The panel discussion provided a pivotal platform for reflection and strategizing on the engagement of Temporary Foreign Workers (TFWs) in Canada.

The conversation centered on the comprehensive support needed for Temporary Foreign Workers and showcased advancements achieved through the Migrant Worker Support Program, funded by Employment and Social Development Canada.
